

Daughter's Faith May Keep Rita From Movies

New York. (AP)—Rita Hayworth's shapely legs and eye-fetching curves may have to go into hiding.

The spiritual head of the Islamic Mission of America says that if the glamorous screen star raises her daughter as a Moslem she'll have to hide her own physical charms under a thing called a "kamis."

A Kamis is a loose-fitting, sack-like robe which veils just about everything but face and hands.

What's more, says the Moslem spokesman, Rita will have to forego bathing suits, pork and palpitating screen kisses.

"It is immoral for a man to kiss a woman in public," Shaikh Daoud Ahmed Faisal declared from his Brooklyn headquarters.

Bartley Crum, the red-haired actress' lawyer, recently disclosed that Rita had agreed to rear her infant daughter, Yasmin, in the Moslem faith of her father, Prince Aly Khan. In turn, Rita asked Aly, whom she plans to divorce, to set up a \$3,000,000 trust fund for 15-month-old Yasmin.

The shaikh said that if Yasmin is brought up in the Islamic faith, her mother must virtually become a Moslem herself.

The shaikh said the actress could never drink anything intoxicating, or even smoke. Moreover, she would be expected to read The Koran, the scriptures of the Mohammedans.
